I don't want to leave out what I consider one of the greatest leaps I took in my spiritual life! I learned to 'open my mouth!' Yup—I was a member missionary! DRESSES

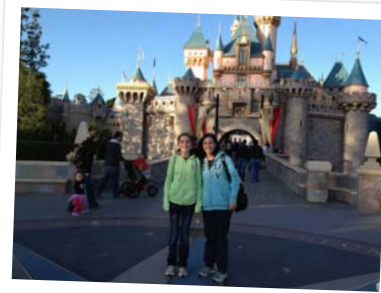

Hannah went to Disneyland with her orchestra and I was able to chaperone. We had a great time!



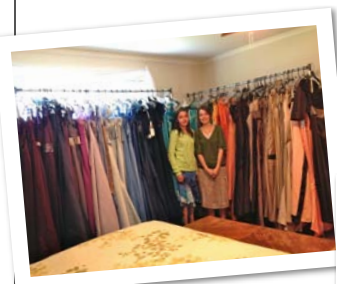
PUPPIES

February - We built a "stack-it-up table" for Savannah's room. Zac and I went caving to blowhole cave west of Utah lake. I painted the family room.



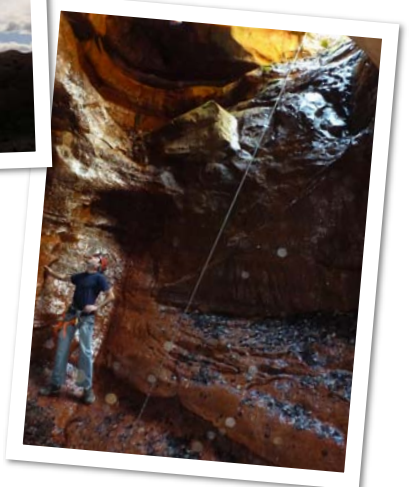

He is very good natured and gets along great with his aunt Zoey. Tyler is just about done with school and will start the graduate school application process soon. Please pray for him to get accepted to Idaho State University, just an hour away in Pocatello, for our sake.

Brianna is back in school and doing well. We all decided that it would be a good idea for her to live at home for a semester or two. It is very difficult to get a job in Rexburg with so many students trying to get the few that there are, plus she has a pretty difficult semester with an Anatomy and Physiology class and lab, an English class (lots of writing), nutrition, Old Testament and an Exercise Science class. She and her mom arranged it so that she can work out with Leslie every morning before any of her classes start. We are really enjoying having her home. She's the same but better.

Last weekend we had a Wilson family reunion. We do them up pretty big since we only have one every twenty years or so. A bout six weeks before my mom fell and broke a hip that needed to be replaced. Luckily her rehab went well and she was getting around pretty well. We had it in a fancy house up above Sundance in Provo Canyon.
