We sure love you all and hope you are Thanksgiving and Mom's birthday party in



of our pumpkins.










Jaxon chose football as his sport this year, and did really well. He was the center on offense, and corner and outside linebacker on defense. He played quite a bit, and his team only lost one game.



 to get to the entrance. It was one of the most decorated caves I've ever been in.


September:
