Jenny finally got her license - the real thing! She is a good driver, but we aren't ready to let her take off with her friends yet. She went to the Sweethearts dance and had a great time.



We got a new-to-us car over Christmas. Aaron's brother, Lee, was wanting to sell his car, so we bought it. It is a little bit nicer than our little car, but we don't really want 2 cars to license and insure. I don't think we could get very much out of our car if we tried to sell it, though. We went to Vernal in January for a branch temple trip. Jason & Misti (Aaron's brother) live there, so they watched our kids for one session. Jaxon & Jancy drive the truck for Aaron while he feeds. Jaxon does really pretty well & Jancy likes to turn the wheel hard one way & then turn it hard the other way. Aaron sometimes has a hard time staying on when Jancy drives

& the cows have to look around for their feed, but she is learning.

Jaxon finally got to go to his "big sunbeam" class. He was very excited to be such a big boy. I thought it would be hard on Jancy, but she hasn't seemed to mind being the big girl in nursery. Jaxon & Jancy play well together & both are good with Amberly. Amberly is growing so fast & thinks she needs to be up looking around & always wants toys. We started feeding her some, but she doesn't love it yet.

There has been a lot of yucky flu & stuff go around, but we have kept ourselves isolated enough that we have all stayed healthy.

We "sold" our pig & gave the kids each \$10. They paid tithing & then Jaxon wanted to buy goggles. We go swimming almost every week & Jaxon always saw the other kids with goggles & wanted them. He is fearless in the water & we have to watch him close. All the kids love it & it is a good family activity. We have fun, too. They have a big kiddie pool so we go in there & all play for an hour or so. We like it also because they usually sleep really well.
