We have just returned from a *great* trip! We left home on Monday, May 16. One thing you may not know about is that we have a hobby! I collect stamps from National Parks and National Monuments. As we visit around the country and see beautiful scenery and historic places which the government has declared as “National” sites, I take my little National Park Passport and collect a stamp from the visitor’s center which has the name of the park and the date we visited. As we left, we traveled over to Price and down to Arches National Park. (Stamp # 1)

We spent a few hours there in the park. It’s beautiful! Even though we’ve been there several times, we always enjoy it. We also went *way* out of our way to visit the Navajo Nations Four Corners Monument—the only place in the United States where four states intersect at one point: Arizona, New Mexico, Utah and Colorado. You can actually have a foot or hand in four states at once. (I’m afraid it was a bit of a disappointment. Our advice—don’t bother!) As we headed south, it was amazing to be able to see Shiprock Peak over in New Mexico.

Now, in planning the trip we couldn’t figure out how to avoid staying overnight on the Navajo Indian Reservation. We were a little nervous about staying in Chinle Arizona, but actually, it was fine! We had made reservations at a Best Western and we were glad that

we could stay right next to Canyon De Chelly National Monument—a beautiful red rock canyon rich in Indian history and full of natural beauty. (Stamp # 2)

From there we stopped at Hubble Trading Post National Historic Site—one of the early points of commerce with the Indians (Stamp # 3) On to the Painted Desert and Petrified Forest National Park. WOW! What a beautiful sight. Acres and acres of beautiful colored rock formations. PLUS petrified logs everywhere! At the visitor’s center we learned that even though petrified wood can be found in all 50 states, ancient conditions made it so that this area has more than any other. (Stamps # 4 & 5)

We then drove through beautiful mountainous roads in the Tonto National Forest,



through Globe, Az and got to Coons’ house in Gilbert Tuesday night. We had a great time with them, picking peaches and making fresh peach pies (yum) for Brittney and Larry’s birthday celebration which we had Wednesday night. Looking at their beautiful yard and garden and *irrigating!* Yup, Todd turned the water in from the ditch at noon on Thursday and soon we surveyed “Coons Lake”. Reminded me a lot of Lewiston and I couldn’t help myself—I had to get out and wade!
