The Sorensens:


Hello to everyone. The Sorensen's are all still kicking. The kids have been sick a lot this spring, and that is getting to be no fun, but we are all still here.

My dad is still into puzzles and coins. He is working on a puzzle that he can make and exchange at the puzzle party in Australia this year.


