

# CASCADE FALLS HIKE

If you are visiting Cedar Mountain you won't want to miss the Cascade falls hike. The views are stunning. The trail is a well designated trail and easy to follow. It is a short 1 mile roundtrip family-friendly hike, although there are a few steep drop-offs, but the trail is wide enough that you can stay closer to the mountainside. It's an out and back type trail and is mostly flat. Pets are welcome on a leash. There are benches along the trail for you to rest and enjoy the views. The trail is accessible late spring through fall after snow pack has melted. The waterfall pours out of the cliff rocks at the end of the trail. The water that flows over the falls originates from Navajo Lake. There is little shade so bring a hat, sunglasses, sunscreen and plenty of water.

### GETTING THERE:

- From Kanab, drive 40 miles north on HWY 89.
- Just past mile post 25, turn left onto HWY 14.
- Drive approximately 15 miles and turn left on the Navajo Lake Road.
- Drive .32 miles and turn left on FR054.
- Drive 1.1 mile and stay right on FR054 until you reach the parking trailhead for Cascade Falls.
- The trail starts out on the right side of the parking lot and follows along the edge of the canyon.
- The views are spectacular as you look back at Zion National Park.
- The trail is out and back.
- The falls are about 4 ft tall and are sometimes dry, but the views are well worth the hike.

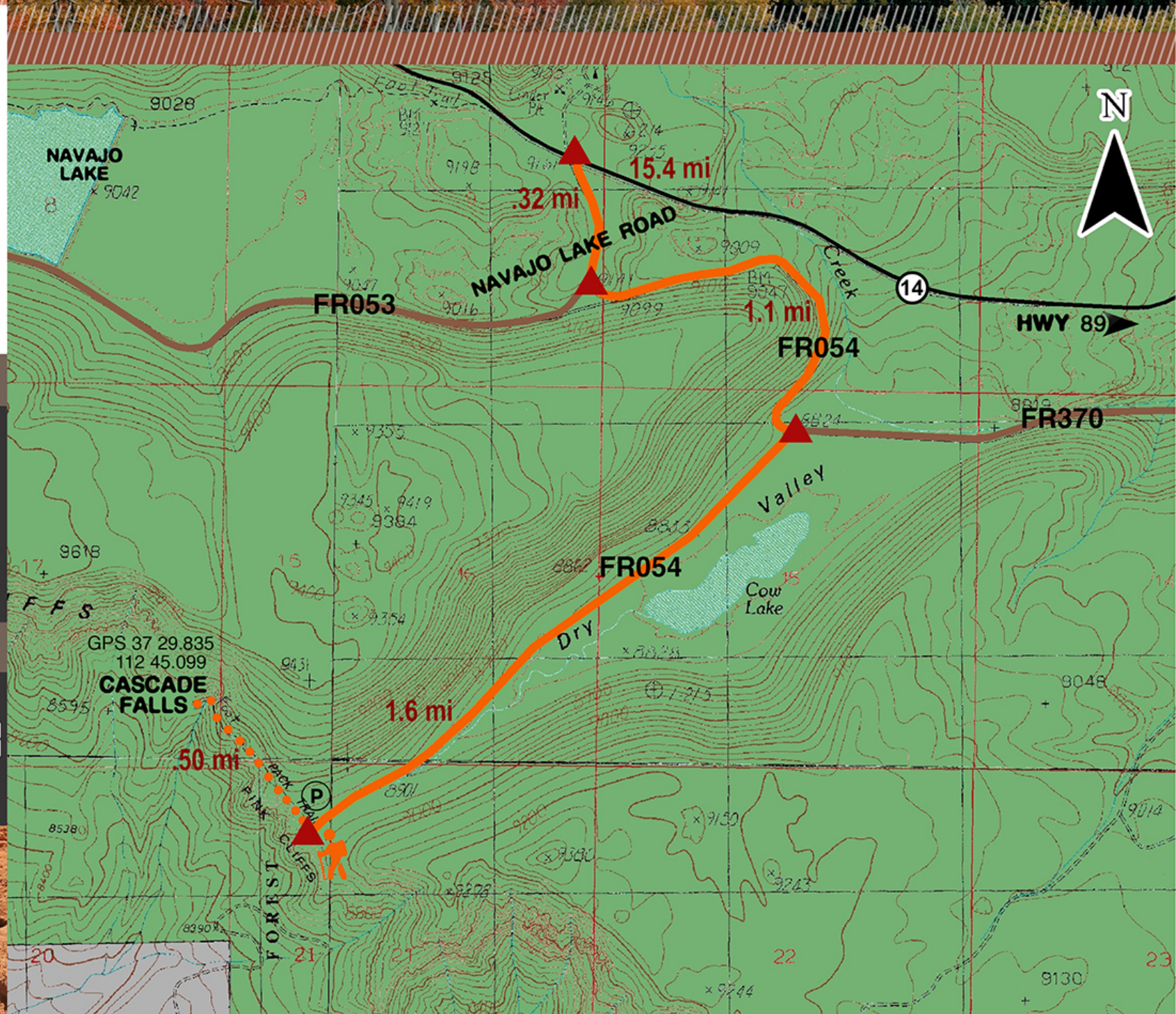
### DISCLAIMER:
