

HORSESHOE BEND OVERLOOK HIKE



OFF THE BEATEN PATH:	NO
BEST SEASON:	YEAR ROUND
VEHICLE:	2WD
HIKING:	1.5 MILES ROUND TRIP

DIFFICULTY:	EASY
ELEVATION:	4327 FEET

Horseshoe Bend is 5 miles south of Page Arizona and is one of the most photographed areas of the Colorado River. The colors of the rocks change throughout the day, the shadows move and the river sparkles with varying hues of green and blue. The hike is just off the highway and only 1.5 miles round trip. It will take you to the top of a horseshoe shaped overlook, with the Colorado River 1100 feet below. The trail is easy to navigate. The overlook can be dangerous, it is steep so don't get close to the cliff edges. In the summer, the uphill hike can be very hot. Be sure to bring plenty of water, sunscreen and a hat.

GETTING THERE:

- From Kanab travel east on HWY 89.
- Drive 72.6 miles to Page, Arizona.
- Drive 5 miles and just past milepost 544, watch for the Horseshoe Bend sign on your right.
- Park in the designated parking area.
- An entrance fee will be charged per vehicle.
- Begin your hike at the trailhead.

DISCLAIMER:
